Bachelor of Applied Arts - Criminal Justice

- 4-year degree
- Full-time program
- 8 semesters
- 2 placements: one in second year and one in third year

Overview

- The program provides students with a broad-based understanding of the Criminal Justice System
- Special emphasis is placed on understanding the societal and individual explanations of why crime occurs and the best societal and individual level responses to crime

Community & Justice Services Diploma

- 2-year diploma
- Full-time program
- 4 semesters
- Students will have an opportunity to practise their skills during a supervised, comprehensive field placement in an institutional or community setting in semesters three and four, two days per week

Overview

- Community Justice is an approach to crime reduction, prevention and rehabilitation that seeks to include the community in the criminal justice process and reduce their reliance on the criminal justice system

Protection, Security & Investigation: Crime Scene Investigation Diploma

- Attain a 2-year diploma in 1 year
- Full-time program
- 2 semesters

Overview

- This unique program is the only one of its kind in Ontario. It helps fill the ongoing demand for qualified crime scene investigators by teaching students about the most modern techniques
- It is an ideal way for university graduates in a related field or Police Foundations diploma graduates to build on knowledge and skills, enhance credentials and improve their career prospects in the area of crime scene investigation

Pre-Service Firefighter Education & Training Certificate

- 1-year certificate
- 2 semesters, beginning in September and February

Overview

- Both theory and extensive hands-on practice
- Learn how fire departments operate the kind of equipment used on the job, techniques, rescue strategies, fire apparatus operation, and emergency care for patients
- Courses on fire behaviour and combustion chemistry as well as hazardous material awareness
- Firefighter fitness training
- Students experience the everyday reality of firefighting by practicing skills in a burn tower

- Humber offers Fire and Emergency Services – Specialized Rescue courses. These courses will enhance your skills and benefit you in your pursuit of a career as a firefighter. A Certificate of Participation is granted upon successful completion of each course. Specialized rescue courses are taught by experienced firefighters

Bachelor of Child and Youth Care

- 4-year degree
- Full-time program
- 8 semesters
- 1 summer placement
- Advanced standing available to students with the 3-year CYW diploma with a GPA 70% or more and either grade 12 or College equivalent English with a grade 70% or more
- CYW graduates could complete the 4-year BCYC degree with an additional 2 years
- Graduates of SSW, ECE and CJS diploma programs are also eligible for transfer credits but will still require the full four years to complete the BCYC credential

Overview

- Learn psychology, addictions and mental health, child and adolescent development
- Courses in research, in addition to completing a praxis based thesis (fully integrated with student placements)
- Study includes youth empowerment and mobilization, international youth work
- Field projects as well as a 14-week summer internship

- Full-time program
- 6 semesters
- Eligible to apply for the Child and Youth Care Degree Program with advanced standing (entry: semester 5)

Social Service Worker Diploma

- 2-year diploma
- Full-time program with part-time option
- 4 semesters
- Three unpaid field placements

Overview

- Both theory and hands-on practice
- Study human behaviour and development, communication, interviewing and counselling skills, and how to work with groups and communities
- Work with people experiencing distressing events and situations
- Students learn how to help people assert their rights and meet their responsibilities in ways that empower them
- 3 field placements allow participation in more than one type of agency

Developmental Services Worker Diploma

- 2-year diploma
- Full-time program
- 4 semesters
- 5 field placements including:
 - A 3-week placement that takes place in the fall semester of year one
 - The second 3-week placement that occurs in the winter semester of year one
 - The 3 consecutive placements during the winter semester of year two, for 4-days per week for 14 weeks

Overview

- Both theory and hands-on approach
- Study the stages of human development, developmental disabilities, psychology and pharmacology
- Learn about available community support services, practical intervention techniques, person-centered planning, supporting people with autism, augmentative forms of communication and effective responses
- Build skills in interpersonal relationships and counseling, communicating with clients in sign language, safely administering medication, creating effective behavioural programming and assisting individuals with physical disabilities

Developmental Services Worker Accelerated Diploma

- Full-time accelerated
- 10 months
- 3 consecutive semesters
- During the second semester, students complete 20 days of placement. Third semester placement is seven weeks and takes place during the summer period (May to June)

Overview

- The accelerated diploma program teaches skills to effectively promote the physical, mental and emotional health of individuals with special needs
- Learn the stages of human development, the types of developmental disabilities and the range of available community support services for this population
- Build expertise in our counselling labs, which provide an ideal setting to develop abilities in working with individuals with limited verbal skills

- Graduates support people with intellectual disabilities, autism, physical challenges or other special needs. This can lead to a range of positions, including:

Addictions and Mental Health Postgraduate Certificate

- Full-time, 10-month program
- 3 consecutive semesters
- Postgraduate certificate
- Full-time, 8-week field placement

Overview

- Acquire best practice skills for working in the field of addictions and mental health
- Develop skills in using standardized assessment tools and addiction treatment services
- Gain knowledge in different clinical treatment models and their application
- Acquire cultural competencies to address the needs of a diverse population
- Achieve competency in working from an integrated interprofessional team model

Transfer Agreements

Bachelor of Applied Arts - Criminal Justice Griffith University, Queensland Australia

Humber graduates will be considered for direct admission into the Master of Criminology and Criminal Justice program provided that all academic and other entry requirements of the Master's degree program are met.

Child and Youth Worker Diploma 25 Transfer options Including Australia and USA

Humber graduates with an overall GPA of 70 per cent or more will be considered for admission to Humber's Bachelor of Child and Youth Care degree program in over 25 educational institutions.

Social Service Worker 25 Transfer options Including Australia and USA

Humber graduates with a B average (3.0 GPA) or higher will be eligible to receive up to 45 transfer credits toward a four-year Bachelor of Social Work in over 25 educational institutions.

How to Apply

Step 1:

Choose your program area of study.

- Once you have researched your programs and have two to three programs you would like to discuss, you can book an advising appointment with one of our Student Recruitment Advisors, contact the program coordinators or visit the Open House. International students should visit international.humber.ca for information about programs and services at Humber.
- Visit us on campus. Visit the humber.ca website more details on campus tours and events.

Step 2

- Individuals can apply online at ontariocolleges.ca or call 519.763.4725 or toll-free 1.888.892.2228 (in Canada only).
- A \$95 fee (payable to Ontario Colleges) is required for each academic year and must be submitted at the time of application.
- Ontario Colleges receives, records and then forwards application information to the appropriate college(s)
- For the 2015/2016 academic year, please apply before February 1st, 2015 for equal consideration. International students can apply directly to Humber College.

Step 3

- All educational documents should be forwarded to ontariocolleges.ca. Grades will be transmitted electronically for all applicants currently enrolled in an Ontario high school.

Step 4

- Beginning early December, Humber will acknowledge that applications have been received and provide MyHumber access details by using the email address provided on the Ontario College's application.
- Humber may need to contact you during the admissions process. It is important that applicants keep their contact information up to date.

Step 5

- Applicants may begin to track their application online at MyHumber.
- Access details are provided when we acknowledge by email, that the application has been received.

Important Dates

November 2014

- Colleges begin to receive application information from ontariocolleges.ca for fall 2015 admission.

February 1, 2015

- All applications received by ontariocolleges.ca on or before February 1 will be given equal consideration in the application process.
- Applications received after February 1 will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis depending on the availability of space in the program. Check for program availability.
- First release of admission decisions.

May 1, 2015

- Applicants must confirm which offer of admission they are accepting. This must be done online at ontariocolleges.ca or by phone at 1.888.892.2228. Late confirmations will only be accepted if space is available in the program.

June 24, 2015

- Tuition fees are due. Please see the Fee section in this publication. Late fees will only be accepted if space is available in the program.
- An offer of admission may be withdrawn if an applicant fails to confirm acceptance and/or pay fees by the stipulated deadlines.
- Applications for winter and spring will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Confirmation dates and fee due dates vary depending on the approval date. Applicants should check their documentation closely. Late confirmations and payments will only be accepted if space is available in the program.
